COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Toss your sketchbook and some simple tools into your daypack and explore Rocky Mountain National Park! Through instruction, demonstrations, and free exploration time, you will develop the skills necessary to capture the beauty around you. Approaches will include simple sketches with pencil, ink, colored pencils and watercolor. On the first morning, participants will learn or sharpen basic sketching and observation skills before heading out to practice these skills in a variety of locations throughout the park.

This workshop is for:

- Beginners (Beginners are welcome and encouraged).
- Journal-keepers who want to add illustrations to their writing.
- Artists who want to fill their sketchbooks.
- Gardeners and naturalists who want to learn more about the world around them.
- Travelers who want to record their journeys.
- Dreamers, scientists, observers, recorders, or anyone who wants to improve or acquire skills in all these categories!

COURSE LEVEL: II

Short-distance walks throughout the day primarily on level terrain.

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CAR-POOLING: Rocky Mountain Conservancy - Field Institute courses utilize car-pooling to limit vehicles traveling into the park. Car-pooling makes it easier to keep the group together, reduces transit time, and allows courses greater access because fewer parking spaces are required at destinations. In addition, it provides an opportunity for participants to discuss course material in small groups during transit. Typically, a few participants from each course volunteer the use of their vehicles for car-pooling to course locations.

Supply List:

Note: We will be painting outdoors on location. So, we need to be prepared for this. Our supplies should be easy to carry.

- Watercolor sketchbook The paper should be at least 140-lb. weight spiral-bound, hard-bound, or soft-bound. Moleskine, Canson, Strathmore, Stillman and Birn, Aquabee "deluxe" are a few brands, and sizes vary – at least a 6" X 8."
- Watercolors Prang watercolor set 8 colors or travel-size watercolor set water-soluble colored pencils.
- **Watercolor pencils** If you have them.
- Watercolor brush Travel brush. It helps to have a larger round brush size 6, 8 or 10 or water brush Koi, Pentel or Niji brands.
- Pencil 2B or Mechanical pencil .05 or .07
- **Waterproof fine-tip marker** Micron Pigma size .05 or .08 is a nice marker.
- **Kneaded eraser**
- Lightweight foldable chair or stool
- Hat
- Bug spray and sunscreen
- Snacks and water to drink
- Camera
- **Plastic bag** For trash.
- Water container
- Small spray bottle You will need to keep your paints moist.
- **Paper towels** Paper or cloth towel.

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ALSO BRING:

- Sack lunch, snacks, WATER
- Binocular
- Wear comfortable clothing

- Camera (optional)
- Light field stool/mat (optional)

REMEMBER TO BRING THE 10 ESSENTIALS:

Rocky Mountain National Park recommends that hikers always carry the 10 essentials in their daypacks.

Raingear

- Map and compass
- Pocketknife
- First-aid kit
- Candles

- Flashlight or headlamp
- Matches or other fire starter
- Extra layers of clothing

Sack lunch, snacks, water

Sunglasses and sunscreen

Note: Rocky Mountain Conservancy - Field Institute recommends that participants for all courses dress in layers and wear comfortable, sturdy hiking boots/shoes. Participants should be prepared for sudden changes in temperature and weather conditions.

REFUND POLICY:

Cancellations received at least 14 days prior to the start of a class will qualify for a refund minus a cancellation fee of \$25 per participant for a one-day class, \$50 for a multi-day class, \$5 per kid's class and \$15 per half-day class or bus tour seat. Registration money transferred to another class will be subject to a \$10 switch fee. Cancellations received less than 14 days prior to the start of a class or bus tour will not generate a refund. If the Field Institute cancels a class, every effort will be made to place the participant in another class; otherwise, a full refund will be given.

TEACHER RECERTIFICATION CREDIT:

Most courses are eligible for teacher recertification credit through the Centennial Board of Cooperative Education Services (BOCES). The fee is \$25 per class (.5 unit) or \$25 per series of threaded courses (1.0 - 3.0 units). A list of threaded courses can be found online at www.RMConservancy.org. Participants must enroll in all courses of a threaded series in order to qualify for the \$25 multi-unit fee. Please be prepared to pay for this credit with a check, made payable to BOCES, on the first day of a class or on the final day of a threaded series of courses.
