LOCATION: Upper Beaver Meadows

Take Hwy. 36 toward the south entrance of Rocky Mountain National Park. After passing through the Beaver Meadows entrance station, continue straight ahead on Hwy. 36 as it curves to the right. You will see a sign which reads "Upper Beaver Meadows." Turn left and follow the dirt road all the way to the end (two miles). Meet the instructor by the restrooms near the parking lot.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Long before us, Native Americans called this place home. Through this fun exploration through time, children will be able to experience part of what life was like for the Native children that lived in this area long ago! Kids will learn how Natives started their day, what they ate, and their daily chores. They will learn and play a few of the games that some of the earliest settlers loved. Participants will learn a basic understanding of which Native people once lived in what is now Rocky Mountain National Park, and what life was like for those Natives both long ago as well as today.

COURSE LEVEL: II

Short-distance walks throughout the day primarily on level terrain

10:30 AM Games of the Native peoples
