**LOCATION: Poudre Lake Trailhead** – Drive Trail Ridge Road from the Beaver Meadows entrance station through Rocky Mountain National Park to the parking area for the Continental Divide at Milner Pass (approximately 25 miles).

TIME: 7:00 AM - 4:00 PM

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This hike on the western slope of Rocky Mountain National Park affords panoramic views of the Never Summer Mountains, Gorge Lakes, and both sides of the Continental Divide as participants traverse subalpine and tundra terrain to the top of Mount Ida. Possible sightings of bighorn sheep and elk can be enjoyed from the many lookout points along the way.

**COURSE LEVEL: IV** 

Hike of more than five miles with elevation gain of more than 1,000 ft.

Roundtrip mileage: 9.6 miles Elevation gain: 3,012 ft.

Maximum elevation reached: 12,889 ft.

**EXPECTATIONS:** Professional conduct will be expected from participants at all times. Individual ideas will be respected. Except during course breaks, cellular phones, pagers, and personal entertainment devices are strictly prohibited in the classroom and during field sessions.
