







A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In our second year since the pandemic began, we are finding our way through a complicated world that seems forever changed. With the help of our stakeholders, including you, we are embracing these transitions and working hard to rebuild programs that are more creative, dynamic and well-adapted to the needs of our community. Despite the ongoing challenges, I am happy to report another historic year of philanthropic success at the Conservancy, allowing us to fund even more improvements and projects to help protect and conserve Rocky Mountain National Park.

In 2021, the Conservancy invested more than \$1.6 million in support of Rocky, funding important projects and enhancements designed to protect the park and improve the visitor experience. These projects ranged from raising funds to replace the Search and Rescue Team's aging tactical vehicle, to installing 30 new bear boxes at Moraine Park Campground. Wildfire recovery was also at the forefront of our support to Rocky, as the East Troublesome and Cameron Peak fires of 2020 burned roughly 30,000 once pristine acres in the park. Answering the call for help, the Conservancy provided \$382,000 to support wildfire prevention, the redesign of the Green Mountain Trail – which was completely obliterated by the fires – and other important recovery initiatives. This trail is scheduled to be open to hikers again by the summer of 2022. We also launched an inaugural Fire Corps to help address the unique challenges of fire stewardship.

More than 4.4 million visitors traveled through Rocky's incredible landscape during 2021. The sheer volume of visitors to Rocky, and the need to address park impacts, has made our stewardship programs more vital than ever. Our youth Conservation Corps made repairs to 41 different trails inside the park and in adjacent National Forests. Altogether, they improved 205 miles of trails, gathered 525 pounds of trash and plastics, and removed 635 fallen trees from hiking trails. We also helped to fund the ongoing work to improve the Longs Peak Trail, rebuilding the section of trail from Battle Junction to Chasm Lake. The Longs Peak Trail Improvement Project is a multi-year effort, with the intent of bringing you a trail that will last generations.

As we continue to navigate uncertain waters, I am proud of the adaptability and resourcefulness of the Conservancy staff and board in rising to the challenge. I am also incredibly grateful to our community for supporting us and providing the important resources that we needed to deliver for Rocky. Thank you for being an indispensable part of our journey, our mission and our success for more than 90 years.



NEXT GENERATION

With funding from the Conservancy's Next Generation Fund, the Junior Ranger program continued to encourage kids to explore, learn and protect the park. And while formal ranger programs could not be offered during the pandemic, the Education and Outreach team assembled nearly 3,000 Junior Ranger Discovery Packs filled with scientific tools. All together, the funding for the Junior Ranger program resulted in more than 40,000 visitor contacts.

CONSERVATION CORPS

After running a reduced program in 2020, the Rocky Mountain **Conservancy-Conservation Corps** program returned to near full strength in 2021. With seven crews spread over five different areas, the **Conservancy Conservation Corps was** able to make dramatic progress in trail corridor development, wildfire restoration and mitigation, watershed health, erosion management, and reopening invaluable recreation areas throughout Northern Colorado. In 2021, the Conservancy also launched its inaugural Wildfire Crew which partnered directly with the RMNP Fire Management Office to train and certify individuals in wildland firefighting and support the mitigation efforts that were needed following the wildfires of 2020.


